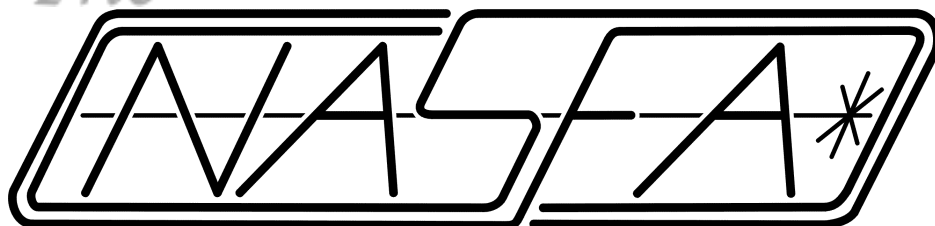

The next **NASFA Meeting** will be **21 January 2017**, at the regular meeting location—the Madison campus of Willowbrook Baptist Church (old Wilson Lumber Company building) at **7105 Highway 72W** (aka University Drive). Please see the map at right if you need help finding it.

JANUARY ATMM

CHURCH/MEETING LOCATION IS MOVING

CONCOM MEETINGS

The first Con†Stellation XXXV Concom Meeting will be at 3P on 18 February 2017—the same day as that month’s NASFA meeting. It will be at the church. There will be a dinner break between the concom and the club meeting. In general, future Con†Stellation XXXV Concom Meetings will be at 3P on the same day as the club meeting, but with at least one exception.

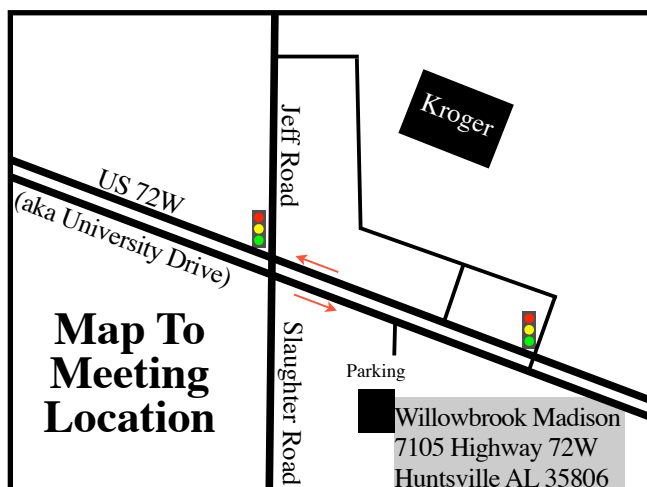
The definite exception will be in April (about which see both

FUTURE CLUB MEETING DATES/LOCATIONS

NASFA CALENDAR ONLINE

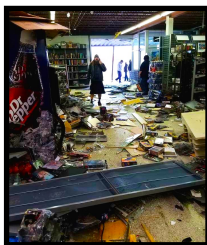

THE DEEP HIT BY CAR

The DeeP Comics & Games <www.deepcomics.com> on Memorial Parkway in Huntsville AL was struck by an SUV on 6 January 2017 when the driver reportedly had a seizure. There was fairly extensive (but primarily non-structural) damage to the property and a lot of destroyed merchandise, but no injuries due to the collision itself. HUGO/CAMPBELL NOMS OPEN

The nominations period for the 2017 Hugo Awards and the Campbell Award has opened. Members of the 2016 (Kansas City), 2017 (Helsinki), and 2018 (San Jose) Worldcons are eligible to nominate. Nominations will close on 18 March 2017

at 06:59 UTC (11:59P PDT on 17 March 2017). Note that you may nominate only once even if you're a member of multiple eligible Worldcons.

As of this year, there will normally be 6 items/persons as finalists in each category (versus 5 previously). Also there is a new way of counting nominations to determine the finalists and the "5% rule" (which formerly eliminated some finalists) is no longer in effect.

DUFF NOMS OPEN

Nominations for the 2017 Down Under Fan Fund <downunderfanfund.wordpress.com> have been opened and will run through 22 January 2017. The North American winner in this north-to-south year will be expected to travel to Australasia to attend this year's Australian natcon. That will be hosted by Continuum 13 <www.continuum.org.au>, to be held 9–12 June 2017 at the Jasper Hotel in Melbourne VIC. Fannish travel to other parts of Australasia is also encouraged.

RIP PETER WESTON

If you've seen a Hugo trophy any time in the last many years, you've seen the work of Peter Weston. He created the modern version of the iconic rocket for the 1984 Worldcon and since then all metal Hugo Award trophy rockets have been cast from his mold at the foundry he owned. (There have been some non-metallic rockets used during these 3+ decades.) Wesson was 73 at the time of his death.

If he'd had no hand in physical form of the Hugo award, he'd still have had quite a fannish career, including chairing the 1979 Worldcon in Brighton, UK. SFWA MODS GAME WRITING QUALIFICATIONS

The Science Fiction & Fantasy Writers of America <www.sfwaworld.org> has updated their Active Membership qualifications for game writers—generally loosening them. The organization added their first set of qualifications for game writers recently. This update addresses “complaints [...] about the exclusion of salaried writers, the limit on number of collaborators, [...] and the exclusion of game mechanics.”

AXANAR LAWSUIT UPDATE

In the Axanar Productions/Paramount (*et al.*) lawsuit, the judge has denied motions for summary judgement by both parties. That said, Axanar came out much the worse in the rulings since the Fair Use defense has been specifically disallowed. He also found that there is “objective substantial similarity” of the Axanar work to copyrighted Star Trek work. Determination of “subjective substantial similarity” is—per the ruling—a matter for a jury to decide. The current trial date is 31 January 2017.

ANOTHER RIGHTS LAWSUIT

Well, we have another one. And it's even Trek adjacent.

In the Fall of 2016, Kickstarter (crowdsourced) funding was secured by ComicMix to publish *Oh, The Places You'll Boldly*

Go!, (writer, David Gerrold; artist, Ty Templeton) which would have a distinct Seussian flavor. Unsurprisingly, Dr. Seuss Enterprises (DSE) countered that the project would infringe on their copyright for Dr. Seuss' *Oh the Places You'll Go!* The lawsuit was filed in November.

Said suit is in its early stages yet, with motions and counter motions being filed between DSE and ComicMix, Gerrold, *et al.* The latter is asking for dismissal based on the Fair Use doctrine. (And besides, we don't use any copyrightable elements, so nyah!)

THE BIG 5 ARE, WELL, BIG

Some time back, data visualization (*et al.*) maven Ali Almosawi has published a chart showing the ownership/control of the several hundred companies that are collectively part of the "Big 5" US book publishers. See his website at <almossawi.com/big-five-publishers>. The data trace back to mid 2016, so by now a number of changes have doubtless been made. Nonetheless, it can help you trace the spiderwebs that make up these behemoths.

BAEN TO USE LEXILE SCORING

Baen Books <www.baen.com> announced they will be providing Lexile scoring <lexile.com> all future YA releases (as well as select other "YA suitable" books). Lexile scores are a way to match the reading level of a student to particular material. They are used by librarians, educators, and home schoolers. Separately, Baen also provides teaching guides for some titles <www.baen.com/ya_guides>.

GENRE FILMS IN NAT'L FILM REGISTRY

YOLEN MID-LIST AUTHOR AWARD/GRANT

The winner of the 2016 **Jane Yolen Mid-List Author Award** (sponsored by the Society of Children's Book Writers

and Illustrators <www.scbwi.org> but created and funded by Yolen herself) has been announced. Yolen chooses the winners from a list of submissions. The award, which includes a \$3000 grant, went to **Jan Peck** (*The Green Mother Goose*, *Giant Peach Yodel*, and other children's books). Two runners-up were also chosen—Deborah Trotter and Joan Donaldson.

LE GUIN FELLOWSHIP

The winner of the 2016–17 **Le Guin Feminist Science Fiction Fellowship** (presented by the University of Oregon Center for the Study of Women in Society <csws.uoregon.edu>) has been announced. The fellowship (“to encourage research within collections in the area of feminist science fiction”), which includes a \$3,000 award, went to **Theodora Goss**.

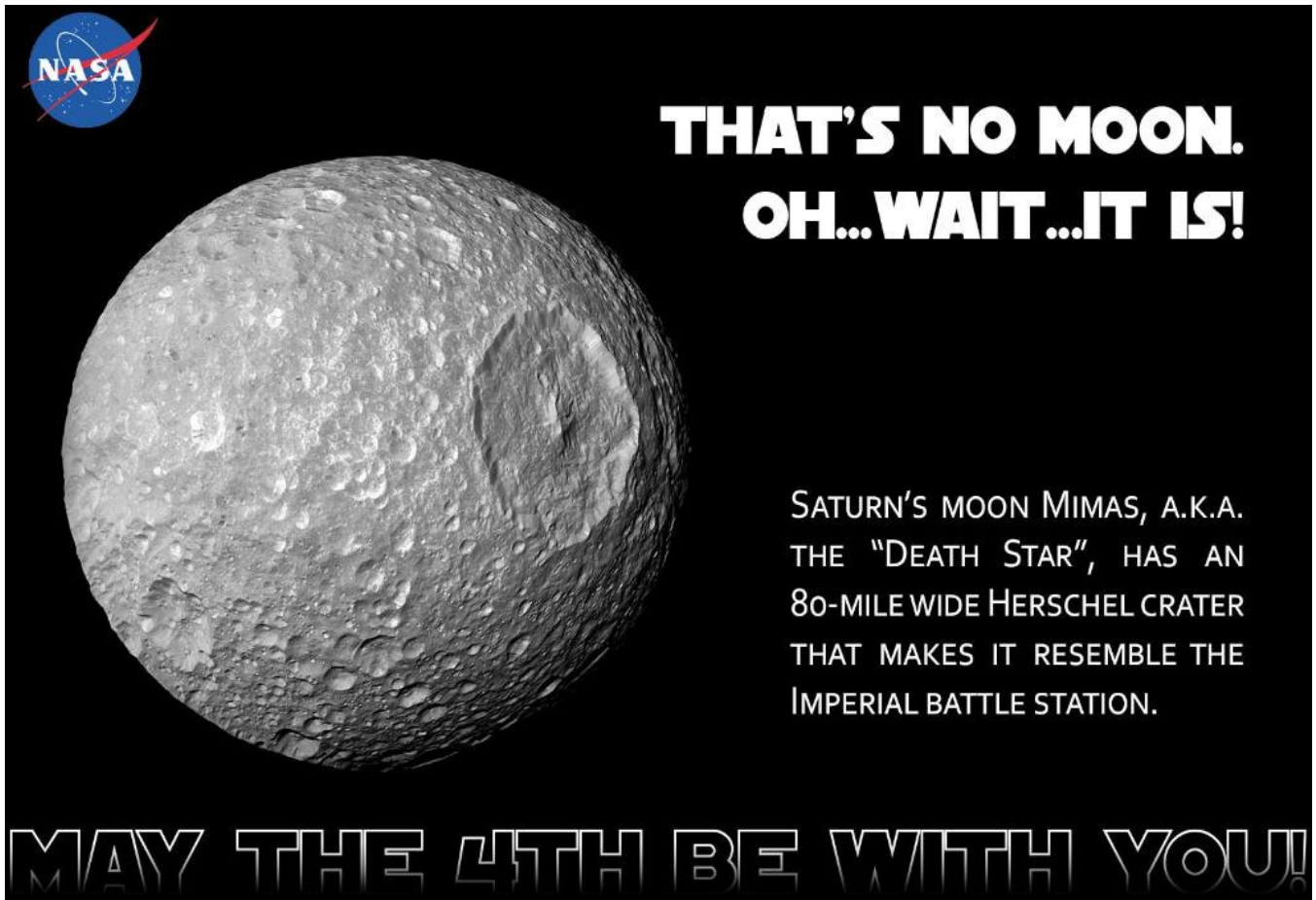
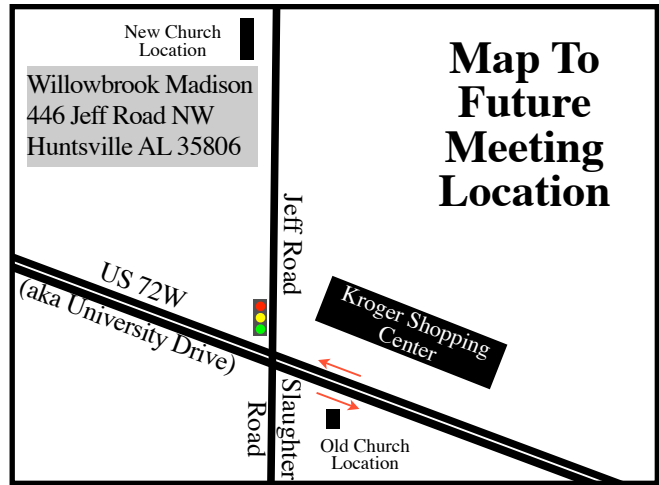
